"4-H, a great youth organization where families can grow, learn, and succeed together... as a family" -Anonymous Greene County 4-H has designed a new program called Tour de-Horse! Just as the name suggests, we will be touring and learning all things horse! This is designed

for youth ages 9-18 who LOVE horses, but doesn't necessarily have one!

The group will meet the first Tuesday of every month at 6pm for our 'classroom' portion of the program where we will learn information regarding horses. Then at the second meeting of the month, either on a early out or teacher workday, will go tour a horse related event or facility!

This program will begin in September and will end at the Hippology contest in March! All participants who are enrolled will compete at this state competition! Hippology is not the study of hippos as the name may suggest, but it's a contest that has different ways to test youths knowledge of horses. They will have to be able to identify feeds, equipment, and different horse breeds as well as be able to judge a horse. There will be a written test and a group problem for the teams to work on together.

How to become a 4-H'er?

4-H is one of the only youth organizations that membership is FREE for all youth! Youth, ages 5-18, become members by completing a 4-H member enrollment form, medical release form and agree to the 4-H Code of Conduct. These forms must be updated every year. If your child would like to become a 4-H'er please go to our website www.ces.ncsu.edu/greene then look on the left menu bar for the 4-H

Youth Development, click here and scroll down to print off these forms. OR you can contact Emily Hardy to learn more about how 4-H can benefit you and your family and to request these forms. The forms are a mandatory part of 4-H and must be completed to their entirety. 4-H enrollment is open for youth ages 5-18 and this age is determined by the age of the child as of January 1st of that year.
