



- Registration for day camps end two weeks before the date of the camp begins and is on a first come first serve basis with registration and money in-hand. Clover cash can be used for these camps, please indicate you wish to use it when paying.
- Lunch will not be served at these camps, with one exception, STEM Camp. Participants should bring a bagged lunch with them each day of the camp or make other arrangements for lunch. Snacks and drinks will be provided.
- Participants should wear closed toe shoes to ALL camps, with the exception of the Fish, Dolphins, & Ponies, in which water shoes are required.
- All ages of camps are determined by January 1st of 2015 and 4-H Enrollment Forms are required for attending camps.
- All registration fees are NON-REFUNDABLE to cover supplies, snacks, transportation, and insurance. Registration fees will be returned if camp is cancelled and notification to parents will be made as soon as possible if a camp is canceled.
